The Many Hands Peace Farm is an educational farm dedicated to teaching apprentices and The Mountain Retreat & Learning Center's guests about the concepts and techniques of regenerative agriculture.

SUMMARY OF KEY DUTIES

Farm hands will be a part of The Mountain's farm team, working to further our mission of being an ecologically-conscious retreat and learning center, making a difference in the world.

Farm hands will carry out duties associated with the day-to-day and long-term operation of our farm. This includes duties associated with the planting, cultivation, harvesting, and processing of our many products, as well as caring for our livestock. Our work can require standing, walking, stooping, bending, and lifting up to 50 pounds for long periods of time outdoors in all weather conditions.

SPECIFIC JOB RESPONSIBILITIES

Livestock

- Feed and water livestock
- Collecting and cleaning eggs
- Clean and maintain animal housing areas and equipment
- Harvesting and composting used bedding and manure

Field/Food Forest

- Seed starting in our greenhouse and hoop house.
- Fertilization (moving manure, leaves, woodchips, and fish emulsion in large quantities)
- Planting starts
- Pruning and caring for plants throughout their growth cycles
- Weeding and maintaining existing rows and paths
- Harvesting

Foraging

- Locating and foraging wild mushrooms and plants
- Identifying safe wild edibles
- Completing the Wild Mushroom Food Safety Certification

Guest Interaction

- Leading/Assisting workshops and tours
- Supervising apprentices, volunteers, and guests in the field
- Working Farm Dinners (Cooking-Serving-Cleanup)
- Preparing for and Vending at Farmer Market

- Experience: 1-2 years of related experience farming or agriculture
- Excellent communication skills with people of all ages, including listening, speaking, reading, and writing.
- Calm and composed ability to talk with trustees, donors, guests, and volunteers as well as other staff in a
 polite, appropriate manner. Able to give and accept constructive feedback modestly and non-defensively.
- Ability to work flexible, at times intensive hours, including evenings, weekends, and holidays as needed.
