The total fee for the weekend will be \$50. Cooking and clean up will be shared. Send your registration to *THE MOUNTAIN*.


### RESERVATIONS FOR FALL



In April, trees and limbs were down, wires were down, many cabins and buildings were nearly down . . . the kitchen was bare and generally unpleasent, sporting many aged unopened cans of food. The Lodge smelled of the mildew which had found itself a happy home. Generally the place looked as if a strong wind coming up the valley could level it and no one would care.

What a difference has occurred in these 8 months! Never would I have believed the little "ghost town" we UUs purchased could be up and running in time for kids camp, adult programming and special events. The hard work of Mo & Larry, Steve Carter, the Board of Trustees, the staff and hundred of SE UUs is a testimony of commitment and determination.

There's much to be done yet, don't underestimate me. Many buildings and cabins have been rescued--others need our time and caring. The kitchen is a gleaming stainless steel palace, but there is still work to be done there, too. Plumbing, carpentry, erosion, winterizing—all must be attended to. The Highlands Camp and Conference Center is a place, an effort, of which I as a UU am truly proud. Please make some time and go see for yourself.
