REFUEL! Residential Education For Unique Experiential Learning Sept 1997 - May 1998 A Work/Serve/Study Residency for Young Adults, Ages 18 - 22

REFUEL is a 9 month residency for young people seeking direction in defining goals for their future as they move toward independence. In a structured, supportive and creative environment, **REFUEL** participants will develop personal, interpersonal and professional skills. This residency is not a "break" in their studies: it is a demanding program intended to stretch limits mentally, physically and spiritually. The program is intended for, but not limited to UUs who are: 1) High school graduates for whom college does not seem to be the next step; 2) People who may have experienced some college and are disenchanted; 3) Young adults who are clear that they need to make some changes but are uncertain as to how to proceed. The primary components of **REFUEL** are:

- Personal Growth, including:
 - Goal Setting, Values Assessment, Outdoor Adventure & Education, Journal Writing, Career Search and Resume Writing
- Academics/Continuing Education, which includes:
 - Access to the Arts, an individualized reading program, "Hard Skills" Building in areas of specific interest to the participant, and Leadership Training
- Work Service: on-site and in the Larger Community
 - All participants will be given quality training in various job areas at the mountain; they will
 research needs in local communities and work on a long-term project

"Semester" and Final self-evaluations will be completed by individuals and measured by goals set at the beginning of the program.
