MountainCamp Setting Nestled in western North Carolina's Blue Ridge, The Mountain Retreat and Learning Center sits atop Little Scaly Mountain, 4,200 feet in elevation. This is the land of clear mountain streams, hardwood forests, waterfalls and high mountain balds. Our location provides a natural playground with endless outdoor adventure opportunities. Our 84 acres of mountain woodland borders National Forest land and offers a variety of hiking trails, lake swimming, canoeing and kayaking, open fields for play, and a low/high challenge course.


Creating Your Day

The Mountain promotes individual choice and responsibility. Campers determine their own schedule based on the activities offered and what appeals to them. All activities reflect careful planning of developmental and thematic content. This allows us to offer support and to challenge campers at their level of development.

Following morning circle each day, groups will depart for off-site adventures, like rafting the Nantahala, exploring the nooks and crannies of Granite City, or hiking Siler Bald. On-site activities offer a variety of favorite workshops, like tie-dying or learning to juggle, playing Dead Ant on the field, lake fun with the new canoes and playaks, and the thrill of the challenge course. Everyone will show off their talents and participate in entertaining evening programs, friendship, community, and experience wonderful Mountain meals.

All counselors go through an extensive training process providing a responsible, safe, and caring environment. Our counselor-to-camper ratio is 1 to 4 ensuring that youth receive the attention needed to promote community and well being. We are very proud of our MountainCamp Counselors, and many show their dedication by returning year after year.



Junior High MountainCamp June 18 - July 1, 2000 Rising 7th through 9th Grade

Calling all energetic and adventure-seeking young people! Join us for a lively two weeks of fun, community building and exploring our beliefs. Lake and river rafting, overnight camping, and the low/high ropes course are just a few examples of the adventures awaiting you. Energizing workshops, held daily.

Beginning MountainCamp July 2 - July 8, 2000 (Note: New Date) Rising 1st through 3rd Grade

We invite youngsters to join us for six days of exploration and outdoor activities. This is a chance to expose our youngest campers to the natural wonders through experiential education, as they study some of their favorite subjects: animals, plants, earth, rocks, and water. The hands-on activities, trips to the nature center and fish hatchery, hiking, rock sliding, and arts and crafts and music are all part of the program and keep beginning campers focused and busy. Campers will be introduced to a safe and caring environment with the opportunity to explore and grow. Enrollment is limited to 15.





Elementary MountainCamp July 2 - July 15, 2000 \$805 Rising 3rd through 6th Grade

We believe in developing skills through experience and offer campers the opportunity to take hikes and play games in the forest, test their limits on our bouldering wall, go rock sliding, and even spend the night camping out. Young people will learn about themselves and their peers as they participate in creating camp programs such as Worship service and evening family councils. Elementary MountainCamp establishes the enthusiasm in campers that leads them back to The Mountain for years to come. Enrollment is limited to 45.

Work and Adventure 5745 July 2 - July 15, 2000 Rising 8th through 12th Grade

This is a program for the adventurous spiritled Spend two weeks challenging yourself, experiencing nature, and giving back to the community in this quest for challenging environment adventure. "Grunge" takes on new meaning as modern conveniences are left behind; campers will not take showers, wear make-up, or even deodorant, whew! These





adventurers sleep out under the stars every night. During week one, campers will learn the value of community service and give back through work projects. The focus will be on group building and commitment with low and high challenge course activities, rock climbing, and preparing for week two. White-water rafting, four days of backpacking, and exploring the glory of our domain fill the second week of new challenges. Campers will experience the natural world, explore their relationship with each other and, most importantly, learn about themselves. Enrollment is limited to 18.

Senior High MountainCamp July 16 - July 29, 2000 Rising 10th through 2000 Graduates

Join us for Senior High MountainCamp — an opportunity to develop a cooperative and supportive community and have life-changing experiences. Explore your spiritual side by planning Vespers and Worship, or push your physical limits by hiking, white-



water rafting, and the 24-HOUR EXPERIENCE! Try the low and high ropes challenge course and discover the difference positive emotional support makes. "Workday" allows the group to give back to the community and leave a positive gift for other Mountain guests. Everyone will enjoy Theme Day and evening programs designed by the "Spirits," a group of Senior High Camp Leaders selected during MountainCamp '99. Participate in this special camp and open doors to your exciting future. Enrollment is limited to 90.



Summer Long Programs

ASCENDER MountainCamp

All Summer Campers Exploring Nature's Delights
& Experiencing Re-Creation
June 11 - July 15, 2000
Rising 11th through 12th Grades

Ever wonder what it would be like to work at The Mountain? ASCENDER MountainCamp is a 5-week program for young people interested in building skills through hands-on work experience while undergoing team building and personal growth. Nine ASCENDERs will live as a group with two mentors and gain work experience by rotating through various Mountain departments as "apprentices" to qualified staff members. Through time in the kitchen, the main office, youth camp and program implementation, housekeeping and maintenance. ASCENDERs learn new skills, take on greater responsibility and independence. ASCENDERs do much more than work 5 days a week. They also spend 2 days each week focusing on group building and adventure activities, including hikes, white-water rafting, rock climbing, or various other mountain programs. Most past ASCENDERs have stayed on through July and attended Senior High MountainCamp (see discounts).



Interested in working with Youth? Want to become a camp counselor or develop leadership skills? Be a CIT for the summer! CITs will learn the skills it takes to become a camp counselor and responsible leader. Eight CITs will be selected to live as a group with two mentors during the 7-week program. The first two weeks will be spent in training with their group and with counselors during day trips and workshops. While camp is in session, CITs will be responsible for cabin activities, planning field day, and leading an evening program. CITs have 1 day off each week, as well as I trip-training day which focuses on building solid adventure skills. Serving as a CIT is a rewarding and challenging opportunity that requires patience, compassion, empathy, and a commitment to working with youth. Get your application in soon!

Application Information

- An application and 3 references are required to apply for the ASCENDER or CIT program. Please contact Mike Stein, Youth Programs Director at (828) 526-5838, Ext. 234, or e-mail misteln_uga@yahoo.com.
- Allow plenty of time to complete your application so that it is a quality expression of yourself. Applications may be handwritten, typed, or tape recorded. Selection is based on the application and references, not prior Mountain experience. Please make sure all your information is received on time. Closing date is February 15, 20001
- ASCENDER applicants who also wish to attend Senior High MountainCamp must register separately. CIT applicants who are not accepted into the CIT program will have a space held for them in Senior High Camp. However, they forfelt that space if it is not accepted within one week following CIT selections.
- If you are accepted into the ASCENDER or CIT program, the \$150 deposit is due within one week of acceptance.

Milestone Learning Center's Leadership School for Social Justice

Leadership School for Social Justice is an opportunity for rising 10th graders through 2000 graduates to explore their potential as leaders in their communities. Youth and young adults have an important role to play in social change – whether it's in your school, your town or church. Leadership School is for lots of different types of people – those who are already deeply involved in community service or activist work and those who want to begin to understand what social action is all about. The common thread among all of us is that we envision a better world and we want to sharpen our skills to help make it happen.

Leadership School is a way for you to define what issues you really care about and to learn ways for your voice to be heard. The program will incorporate workshops on leadership and social action, a service project, opportunities to hear from various people about their community involvement, and plenty of time to get to know one another and have fun being together.

\$\$ The Price of Camp Has Gone Up! \$\$

Why? Thanks for asking! This increase is necessary to support current standards and increase services. So that you understand the need, here's what the new rates will do:

- Maintain the 4-campers-to-1-counselor ratio.
- Add a full-time Wellness Center medical resource.
- Allow us to significantly increase counselor wages. Our current wages are
 not competitive, and so we cannot attract enough young adults who
 need and deserve reasonable compensation. This is not just a practical
 decision, it is an ethical commitment to acknowledge the people who
 care for our campers!

Instructions for Registration for ALL 2000 CAMPS

- Fill out a registration form (1 copy enclosed) for each camper for each camp s/he will attend. For example, if your camper is attending both Junior High Camp and Work & Adventure, make a copy and fill out one registration form for Junior High Camp and one for Work & Adventure.
- Enclose your nonrefundable deposit of \$150 per camp with your registration forms. WE CANNOT PROCESS YOUR REGISTRATION WITHOUT A DE-POSIT.
- After we receive your registration and deposit, we will send you a confirmation packet in early February 2000. Please fill out and return all pre-arrival forms by May 1, 2000.
- Full payment for camp is due on May 1, 2000, along with your forms. If payment in full is not received by May 1st and we have people on our waitlist for that camp, we will notify you and then cancel your registration. If you cancel after May 1st, after full payment is received, you will receive a 50% refund IF IT IS AT LEAST 4 WEEKS BEFORE THE START DATE OF THAT CAMP SESSION. This policy is the result of a number of last-minute cancellations and "no shows" in past summers, resulting in some campers being turned away because camps were apparently full. Our hope is that this policy will enable us to be clear about our enrollment numbers and pass on space openings earlier to campers who want to attend camp.
- Youth Camps are often filled by February 1. PLEASE
 REGISTER EARLY! If we receive your registration
 You after a camp session is full, we will contact you
 RE immediately, and you can place your name on the
 waitlist and hold your deposit. If you choose to
 remain on the waitlist, you will be informed if a space
 becomes available. If a space opens and you do not
 take it, your deposit is subject to the regular
 deposit refund policy. If no space becomes available.

- you will be refunded your full deposit. You can remove your name from the waitlist at anytime before a space becomes available, and receive a refund of your full deposit. We encourage you to place your child's name on the waitlist because spaces do frequently open.
- If you are in need of financial assistance in paying for camp, please request a Campership Application. You can apply before or after you register for camp, however, a registration and FULL deposit are required to reserve a space in camp. The deadline for receipt of completed Campership Applications is March 1, 2000. In case of additional financial need, please contact us about a payment plan.
- The following discounts apply in 2000.
 - \$50 off basic fees if your child attends 2 or more MountainCamps (excluding 1-week camps).
 - \$10 discount for each additional child that attends a MountainCamp.
 - \$50 discount if we receive payment in full by December 31, 1999.
 - \$20 discount per child per camp if you are a Life Member of The Mountain.
- If your child is attending more than one camp session, our supervised stay-over program is available free of charge. However, you need to register for this service. You will receive a "Camp Stay-Over Registration" form with your confirmation packet. Please return this form by May 1, 2000, along with your other pre-arrival forms if you would like your child to stay in our care in-between sessions.
- If you are planning to stay overnight at The Mountain when dropping off or picking up your child, please be sure to call at least 6 weeks in advance to make reservations. Space is limited.
